# Status report on land deal soon

**Gurgaon:** The status report on the land deals and holdings of Congress chief Sonia Gandhi's son-in-law Robert Vadra in Gurgaon will be submitted soon, newly-appointed Deputy Commissioner T.J. Sarva Prakash said on Tuesday.

He was speaking to media persons after taking charge on Monday evening.

Sarva Prakash later said

the status report will be submitted to the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) and the Ministry of Land Revenue, Punjab. He also said that he will meet the Chief Minister on Wednesday to discuss the status of the land deals.

When asked about the status of the land deals, he said that he would provide a detailed report to the PMO and the Ministry of Land Revenue, Punjab.

attacking the Government on the black money issue.

The Lower House was packed with action as TMC members were joined by the Congress, BJP, AAP and Samajwadi Party demanding a response from Prime Minister Narendra Modi as to when the black money will be brought back.

TMC, Congress, JDU and SP, who had given notices for discussion on black money, demanded the suspension of Question Hour in the Lok Sabha. Later, Opposition parties including the Congress, TMC and SP staged a walk out when the Government did not agree to their demands.

Amidst continuous slogan-shouting in the Well, Speaker Sumitra Mahajan

warned the members against displaying umbrellas. The House took up two questions during the Question Hour but the reply was not audible in the din.

Leader of Congress in Lok Sabha Mallikarjun Kharge earlier pointed out that his party has given a notice for the suspension of Question Hour. But Speaker said it was against the rules though she was willing to accommodate a debate on black money under other rules.

SP president Malayam Singh Yadav, who was sitting next to Congress chief Sonia Gandhi, attempted to speak but could not be heard amid din.

The Speaker then adjourned the House for 40 minutes till noon. The House

was thereafter again adjourned till 2 pm.

When the House gathered again at 2 pm, TMC MP again gathered in the Well as the House shouting 'Jaha nanka dena hoga, 130 di beer gaye, kaha shon Aaha gaya, Jabab do, Jabab tumh dena hoga... Pradhanmantr jabab do'.

In the middle of vociferous protests, Kharge intervened saying he met the Speaker in the morning and sought suspension of Question Hour to allow adjournment motion on the issue. Alleging that the BJP had defamed UPA-II on the black money issue, he sought a discussion on the issue.
